Description

The coastal artillery service was the Kriegsmarine branch responsible for protecting the Reich's coastal borders from both air and sea attack. On June 24, 1941 Grand Admiral Raeder instituted the War Badge of the Coastal Artillery to reward the actions of both individuals and crew members.

Remarks

Much of the original finish has worn away revealing the Tombak base metal. The flaw that rims the base from 4:00 to 8:00 on the bottom of the reverse is clearly visible.
