

## Luftwaffe Flak Badge 1941-1945 (Flak-Kampfabzeichen der Luftwaffe) Unmarked Ball-Hinge/likely Adolf Scholze

### Description

The Ball-Hinge Flak Badge is believed to be one of the earliest produced of the Flak Badges. The elongated eagle's head is unlike any other manufacturer and thus makes this one of the few badges identifiable by maker in photographs. The reverse is lightly scooped, with the characteristic Adolf Scholze ball-hinge as found on other marked badges, such as the minesweeper. There is also a characteristic trapezoidal punch-hole between the wreath, gun base, and breech. This high-quality Buntmetal badge is also found made of zinc.
